JOHN MARSDEN'S TIPS FOR PARENTS:

- Be an adult. Say no to your children at least once a day. If the role of Adult in your family is vacant, then one of your children will fill it. And it won't be pretty.
- 2. Don't take up all the space. If you are dominating, loud, forceful, your children are highly likely to become passive, lacking spirit and personality ... and/or sullen.
- 3. Believe about 40 per cent of the dramatic stories your children tell you of the injustices, corruption and satanic practices happening at school.
- 4. Teach them empathy. For example, after their jubilant victory celebrations when they win a sporting match, remind them that their jubilation was only possible because someone else the losers have been made to feel awful.

Nutrition Snippet

The simp<mark>√est w</mark>oy

... to make baked vegie chips

Serves: 4 I Prep time: 15 min I Cooking time: 20 min

Ingredients

- sweet potato, peeled
- 2 carrots, peeled 2 parsnips, peeled

1 large beetroot, peeled Sprigs of fresh rosemary or thyme Olive oil spray Sea salt



Pre-heat oven to 190°C. Slice all the vegies into thin rounds. Spread them out on paper towels and blot dry. ensure they're as dry as possible.

Line a baking tray with foil and lightly spray with olive oil. Spread the vegies and herbs on the tray and spray them with olive oil and add a dash of salt. Bake for approx. 20 minutes, checking every 5 mins. to ensure they're not burning. Remove any that are brown and crispy before
