NAPLAN Results – Students in Years 3 & 5 took home their results last Wednesday. Parents received an individual report of their child's test results for the tests they sat in May. These tests in key areas of literacy and numeracy provide parents and teachers with a snapshot of how students are progressing individually, as part of their school community and as a nation. This was the first year that we participated in NAPLAN online, and looking at their achievements they coped very well. We congratulate the children in Years 3 & 5 as their results were very encouraging!

Year 3

The students performed well above State & SSSR in all aspects of NAPLAN - Writing, Numeracy, Reading, Spelling, Grammar & Punctuation. This is the seventh consecutive year we have performed at this level in Reading, Writing, Spelling, Numeracy, Grammar & Punctuation.

Here are some of our real successes:

- No student fell below Benchmark
- 100% of students were above the National Minimum standards in all areas.
- 85% of students were in the TOP two bands in Grammar & Punctuation
- 75% of students were in the TOP two bands in Spelling & Writing
- 60% of students were in the TOP two bands in Numeracy
- 50% of students were in the TOP two bands in Reading.

Year 5

From our analysis of the data, year 5 students were above State & SSSR in all aspects of NAPLAN - Spelling for the seventh consecutive year, Numeracy for the sixth consecutive year, Reading for the fourth consecutive year, Grammar & Punctuation for the third consecutive year.

- 100% of students were above the national Minimum Standard in all areas.
- 80% of students were in the TOP two bands for Reading
- 55% of students were in the TOP two bands for Spelling, Grammar & Punctuation
- 35% of students were in the TOP two bands for Writing & Numeracy.
- 78% of students were above their expected growth in Writing, Spelling & Reading

So congratulations to staff, parents & students. If you have any questions please don't hesitate to contact your child's teacher.
