TEN STEPS TOWARDS GENUINE HUMAN ENCOUNTER IN OUR DIGITAL WORLD

2. BE PRESENT TO OTHERS IN THE REAL AND VIRTUAL WORLDS

The speed and brevity of communication on social media platforms can be open to misinterpretation and a superficiality that makes others feel that they have not been truly heard or accepted. Similarly, excessive time spent on social media can deprive families and friends of your 'real' presence in their lives.

- Limit the time you spend on devices.
- Take a 'digital detox' for your health and wellbeing. Times of abstinence and reflection fit well with the Seasons of Lent and Advent.
- Establish device free times in your household, for example at meal

3. TAKE CARE OF YOURSELF AND OTHERS

Unfortunately, cyberbullying, trolling and the objectifications of others is not an uncommon experience. We cannot stand by when another is denigrated of threatened.

- Call out bad behaviour and stand by the victim. This can require diplomacy. Be mindful that sometimes abusive behaviour is so irrational and unrelenting, the best option is to disengage.

Hay Fever: Particularly in these windy and dusty conditions, many of the children are displaying hay fever symptoms that cause them to be quite miserable at school. Hay fever cannot be cured, but there are a number of ways you can improve the symptoms and give your child some relief. Please discuss with your doctor or pharmacist.

Signs and symptoms of hay fever

If your child has hay fever, they may have:

- frequent bouts of sneezing
- a runny nose
- blocked nose (either one or both nostrils)
- itchy ears, nose, throat and roof of the mouth
- red, itchy, swollen and/or watery eyes
- headaches.

If hay fever is left untreated it can lead to poor quality sleep, tiredness and daytime sleepiness. In some cases, hay fever can also:

- make asthma more difficult to control
- increase the chance of sinus infections
