





#### **SPEAK OUT**


Parents and friends are welcome to SPEAK OUT, our Public Speaking Competition, this Thursday 23rd October.

#### **Lego Club Project**


Over the next 8 weeks we will be working on a special Christmas themed project, a Duplo Christmas Tree.



#### **Expressions of Interest Open for Volunteer Hall Committees**

Warrumbungle Shire Council is calling for Expressions of Interest from community members to join Section 355 Volunteer Hall Committees across the region.

Committees are being established for the Baradine Memorial Hall, Binnaway Memorial Hall, Goolhi Hall, Jubilee Hall Dunedoo, Mendooran Mechanics Institute, and Purlewaugh Mechanics Institute.

Section 355 Committees are groups of community members who volunteer their time to help manage Council facilities, care for community spaces, and perform specific functions on behalf of Warrumbungle Shire Council. These committees act as a volunteer extension of Council and play a key role in maintaining and improving community facilities.

Committee responsibilities include assessing hall hire applications, meeting hirers for preand post-inspections, receipting payments, managing bonds, and maintaining financial records. Committees may also carry out minor maintenance, such as replacing light globes or tap washers, or report maintenance needs to Council.

The short-term goal is to encourage more community involvement in the management of local facilities, while the long-term aim is for committees to generate enough income to cover running costs and fund upgrades to items such as chairs, tables, and kitchen equipment.

Expressions of Interest are open from 7 October 2025 and will close at 4:30 pm on Friday 7 November 2025.
